## CSOs Roles in the Ebonyi state draft WASH policy

- Embark on Advocacy campaigns for sustainable WASH development
- Mobilise communities to participate in WASH programmes.
- Implement WASH programmes with government or donor support.
- Build capacity of sector players including WASHCOMs and LGA officials
- Mobilise citizens towards prompt payments of tariffs.
- Embark on Budget tracking and reporting for accountability and transparency
- Monitor the implementation of WASH projects/programmes.

Mass media Roles in the Ebonyi state draft WASH policy

- Produce and publish water supply and sanitation related messages for all stakeholders.
- Monitor the activities in the sector to ensure openness, transparency, and accountability.
- Publish investigative news and articles to promote WASH suitability.

#### WASHCOMs Roles in the Ebonyi state draft WASH policy

- Liaise with the LGA WASH Departments and EBRUWASA to develop Local WASH Plans and implement water supply and sanitation programmes for the communities
- Mobilise community members to introduce Community Led Total Sanitation
- Mobilise community members to ensure provision of latrines in households.
- Work towards the eradication of water borne and excreta related diseases in the communities.
- Mobilise the community to take part in the construction of water and sanitation facilities.
- Mobilise the community to contribute towards capital requirements of water and water supply and sanitation projects.
- Mobilise community members to raise Operation and Maintenance cost of water points and sanitation facilities through tariffs or contributions.
- Mobilise community members towards prompt payment of Bills, efficient use of water supply, monitor and report Illegal connections, report incidences of vandalisation and leakages, and provide security to facilities.
