FG Sends Relief Materials to Kano Clash Victims

Federal Wednesday in Kano, sent relief materials worth eight million pairs to victims of the recent clash in Kano which pitched the Hausa

against the Yoruba.

The materials were delivered to the Kano State Governor, Dr. Rabiu Musa Kwankwaso, by a two-man delegation led by the Deputy Director of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), Alhaji Salisu Shuaibu Makarfi.

The materials were made up of 500 bundles of roofing From Bassey Inyang, Kano

Kuma-Asabe, Rijiya Lemo and other areas where most of the killings took place were dismembered.
